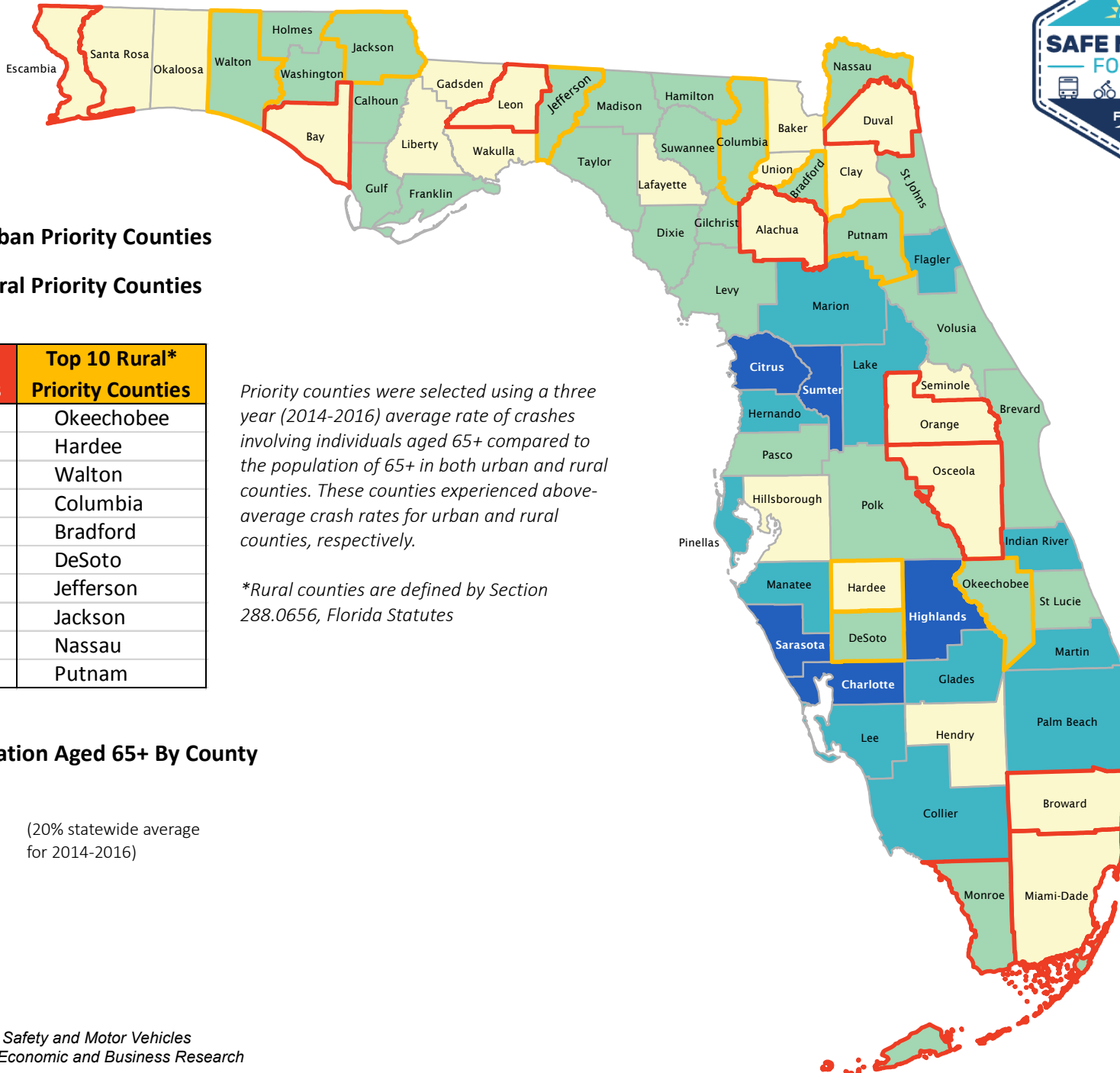


# 2018 Florida's Aging Road User (65+) Priority Counties



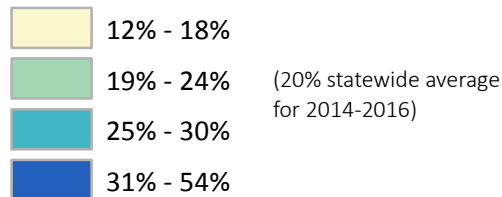

Rank is a statewide ranking of counties based on the crash rate per 1,000 persons age 65 and older. A higher ranking indicates a higher frequency of crashes when controlling for population size.

Crash is defined as a crash report to a law enforcement agency which involved a driver, passenger, pedestrian or cyclist age 65 or older on the date of the crash.
